RE: Year 8 Options and parents evening

Year 8 will begin their Key Stage 4 programme next academic year and therefore the Year 8 Options process will begin this half term, when we will ask all Year 8 students to choose four courses to study during Years 9, 10 and 11. The range of courses on offer to students recognises that each individual is different with different skills, qualities, ambitions and preferred learning styles. We offer a variety of subjects ranging from those that are very practical to those which are very academic and assessed only by work completed under exam conditions.

In Year 9 the timetable is made up of the 'Core' subjects that all students take, plus their 4 option subjects. For most students the Core subjects are: English Language, English Literature, Maths, Combined Science and PE.

What you should do now

- Help your child to identify subjects that they are good at, find enjoyable and which are recommended for them by their teachers.
- Come to the Evening on Thursday 7th February to meet your child's teachers and attend the options talk in the Main Hall. There will be two identical half hour talks at 5pm and 6pm; please indicate on the form over the page which talk you will attend and ask your child to return this form to Student Services. You will have t

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the chance to ask the teachers and Learning Team Leaders any student-specific questions related to the options available. Please encourage your child to make appointments to see their teachers.

- Check your child's targets and progress in lessons and make sure their choices are aspirational but achievable.
- Look at the Options booklet with your child and use the Internet where appropriate to obtain further information.
- Studying a language isn't compulsory but worth considering and discussing with your child. Not only does language study help develop important skills, a GCSE in a modern foreign language is highly regarded by universities, particularly Russell Group Universities and employers alike. There will be more information about this available on the evening.
- Help your child to shortlist ONE choice and ONE reserve from each list.

We look forward to seeing you at the Information Evening next week. If you are unable to attend, the slides from the Options talk will be available on the School Website in the Curriculum section. A copy of the Options Booklet given to students will also be found on the website after the evening.
